

WELCOME TO THE HALIBURTON SCHOOL OF ART + DESIGN

We're looking forward to having you with us in the inspirational Haliburton Highlands. The following details will assist you with your preparations.

Locations:

All courses, unless otherwise specified, are held at the Haliburton Fleming College campus, located at 297 College Drive. Please refer to our online map of Haliburton village to assist you with travel.

Hours (Saturday Courses):

Your class will run from 9:00am to 5:00pm, unless otherwise specified, with an hour midday lunch break.

Food and Beverages:

The food servery is not open on weekends. Please bring your own lunch and drinks. Additionally, there is a microwave and refrigerator available for your use.

Accommodation:

Browse options at Places4Students – search “Fleming College – Haliburton” and then click Property Listings. Additional accommodation information is available through the Haliburton Highlands Tourism department which can also be reached at 1-800-461-7677. We recommend that you inquire about cancellation policies. In our experience, the hosts are very co-operative but it's best to clarify to avoid a situation where you lose your accommodation fees if we or you need to cancel your course (which we will notify you of 2 weeks prior).

Materials you need to bring:

Where applicable, a list of materials necessary for your course is included in this document. Materials may not be available on site – we suggest you bring everything with you. Please feel free to check the status of your course if you are concerned about investing in materials. There are some limited arts supplies available at local retail outlets.

Course Cancellations:

All courses are subject to cancellation in the event of insufficient registration or public health directives. Should your course be cancelled due to insufficient registration, you will be notified 2 weeks in advance of course start by email and/or phone on file. Ensure that we have an alternate means of reaching you if you will not be at home. Assume that your course is running as scheduled unless you hear otherwise. You are eligible for a full refund of fees or the option of transferring to another course within the current HSAD schedule (pending space availability) if the college cancels a course.

Refund Policy:

- If You Cancel: All notifications of cancellation must be received in writing. If you cancel any time up to 14 days prior to course start, you will receive a full refund, less a \$25 administrative fee. If you cancel later than 14 days prior to course start, fees will not be refunded. This policy applies in all circumstances due to our commitment to students and instructors two weeks prior to course start. Should you be able to attend a different course within the current schedule/year we would be happy to attempt to accommodate you, pending space availability.
- Courses are non-transferable.

Mandatory Studio Safety Practices apply – See below

NO OPEN-TOE OR HEEL SHOES IN THE STUDIO

A \$25 material fee payable to the instructor will be needed on your first day of class.

The instructor will provide an assortment of watercolours and bevelled/prepared printmaking plates *for your use while taking the class.*

Each student will be given: ten sheets of high-quality printmaking paper, an assortment of coloured Japanese papers, Chine collé materials and shared class supplies such as Caran D'arch waterbase crayons.

Please bring:

Whatever stiff bristle brushes and watercolour brushes you have. You will not need much more than a 1-inch-wide inexpensive stiff bristle brush. A container for water, a large plastic lid for mixing colours (or whatever you have).

Tweezers if you have them, a pencil, and white paper towels

Your print paper will be 7 1/4" x 10 1/4" so a stiff cardboard folder(larger in all dimensions than your paper) will protect those treasures on the way home.

Students, if they wish, and already have them, can bring their own watercolours (not Winsor Newton) if they have a colour palette they are partial to.

*To keep the presses accessible for maximum printing time for each student, please bring lunch with you that day as lunch will be a short, staggered break. There will be a tea kettle and herbal teas provided by the instructor so bring a mug.

**The instructor will send out an email 3 weeks before the course detailing what plants can be used in this process. The plants used will be as fresh as possible and kept in water to prevent curling. Students will pick plants the morning of the class at your cottage or around the campus, as will the instructor, and we will be sharing them. Bring your plants in dampened paper towels or a water-filled container.

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MANDATORY STUDIO SAFETY PRACTICES

Your health and safety is our priority. Our studio environments can have a number of objects, tools and chemicals that require personal protective equipment (PPE) or other consideration for your wellbeing. All persons (including faculty, staff and students) are asked to observe the following while in the shops and studios:

- **Wear sturdy and appropriate shoes such as sneakers, closed leather shoes or work boots – *open-toed shoes, flip-flops or high heels are not allowed***
- **No long, dangling clothing or accessories** (scarves, flowing sleeves, chains, long necklaces, etc.)
- **Long hair must be tied back**
- **No bare skin if exposure to chemical or tools/machinery is likely**
- **Appropriate PPE is mandatory when operating tools and equipment within the studios.**
Please consult with the faculty or studio technician to determine the appropriate PPE required for specific machines and studio processes.

Fit tests are required for courses requiring a respirator as noted on your material list. Arrangements will be made on site.

As these are mandatory safety practices, we will follow up directly with students who may have overlooked the above. Individuals may be asked to address any concerns before continuing to work in the studio.

Be sure to buy appropriate, good quality safety articles and equipment i.e. safety boots, protective eyewear, hearing protection, work gloves, x-acto knives, etc. – ask your supplier for advice.
